


Suggested themes: obesity – life cycle




Book Title: Lola at the Library

Suggested themes: books, library


Grade level: kindergarten – 1st grade

Grade level: kg - grade 1


Salient linguistic features: teach the students:


Book Title: SIGN Language for Kids by Lora Heller



Salient linguistic features: teach students:


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Grade level: all ages starting from grade 3+
